One of the many highlights of **Excitement Sunday** on September 17, was the gift of the Word through music brought by Jillian Ambrose. Jillian is a gifted musician with a powerful voice – which is great, of course. However, the real gift was in how Jillian allowed the message to **take her over**.

As Jillian sang *I Want to Live Like That*, she was overtaken by the message of the song and began to weep as she sang. It was a holy moment where there was not a single person in the sanctuary who could have missed the depth of feeling and how God was moving in that young woman. She embodied the message: ***I want to live like that and give it all I have – recklessly abandoned, never holding back – so that everything I say and do points to You.***

As she struggled to be able to sing the rest of the song, God's spirit moved again. First one or two and then a bit larger group picked up the words and the tune and sang until Jillian's throat was no longer strangled by strong emotion. As others wrapped their love around her, she was given the strength to "bring it home" -- and bring it home, she did!

Why do we do what we do? Why do we take on leadership roles in the church? Is it because we feel as deeply as Jillian that we want to point to God's love? Or is it because we think that we have all the answers and my way is the only way? Or is it something else – fear? Duty? Power? A need to feel accepted?

When did you last allow God to **take you over**? Fully. Powerfully. Wonderfully. When did you last feel that it was **GOD** shining through you?

So here's what I want you to do, God helping you: Take your everyday, ordinary life—your sleeping, eating, going-to-work, and walking-around life—and place it before God as an offering. Embracing what God does for you is the best thing you can do for Him.

(Romans 12:1)

When we are able to lay our lives – ourselves – at Jesus' feet like that, the meaning and depth of life is deep and wide – filled with wonder and joy. I want to live like **that!**

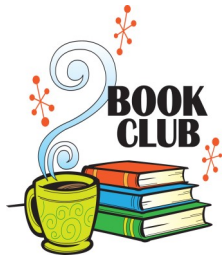
From the Library

The news of the month involves NEW BOOKS. We have added to our collection:

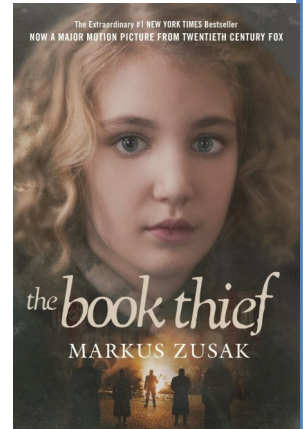

Wednesday, October 18 at 7:00.

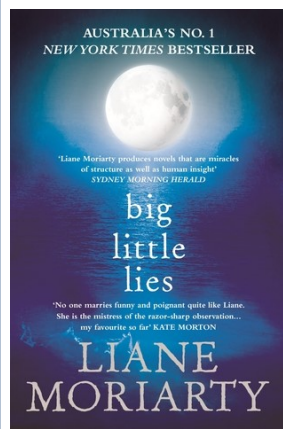
We will discuss

BLESSINGS IN A BACKPACK

Many of you have heard me mention a program call Blessings in a Backpack (BIB) which provides food on weekends for children who receive free lunches at schools. Hopefully, it is finally going to be a reality! The flyer which is in the newsletter explains the program. I was contacted by Glyndon Elementary School, one of the schools that we are partnered with, about a woman who had called about wanting to start a weekend food program for Glyndon Elementary based on the high percentage (over 50%) of children who are in the food program at the school. The guidance counselor who I work with at the school contacted me and I connected with Jill Scheibel. Together we have mapped out a way to help these children by joining forces. She is doing the organizational work with BIB and RUMC will help with space for filling bags and storing the food we purchase with donations. We will also be able to use the Maryland Food Bank to purchase food and thus be able to provide for more children.

We have partnered BIB, to feed at least 50 at risk kids at Glyndon Elementary. It is heartbreaking to think any child in America is going hungry over the weekend with all the food we waste in this country, but it is so true. Children can't sit still and learn on Monday mornings when they have not had proper nourishment over the weekend and BIB has found that after a program has been put in place the children behave better, learn better and in turn make better grades. We will be packing the backpacks on Thursdays at RUMC so that the children will have them each Friday to take home.

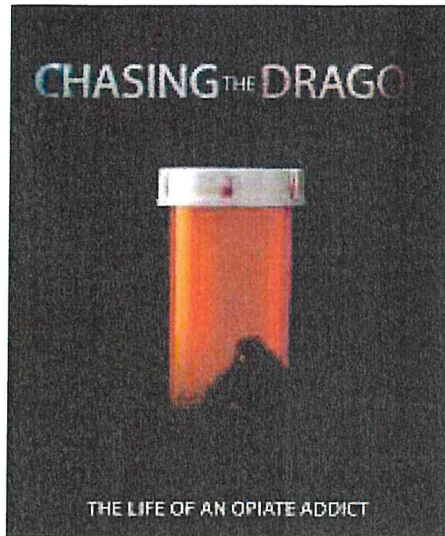
