## From the Pastor

Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? No! In all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. (Romans 8:35, 37-29)

Where do you turn? When you feel that things are out of control or when sadness and pain threaten to overwhelm you, where do you turn?

Several times recently, in the middle of some particularly difficult conversations, the scripture above filled my heart and mind. I'll never forget a woman I met during my clinical training at Spring Grove State Hospital. She told me that, no matter how hard she tried to be positive, she woke every day with a sense of foreboding. She could not break out of her deep, dark sadness, even though most days she didn't even know why she was sad.

Together, we read this passage over and over, and she asked me to print it out for her so she could see it every day when she woke up. It was the first thing she looked at in the morning and the last thing she saw as she lay down to sleep at night.

We hear lots about mantras these days. What do you say over and over? What message do you need to hear? I have found myself wondering a lot lately what might happen if we claim this passage as our message of hope and strength for the difficult days that we face.

Nothing can separate us from the love of God in Christ! Now <u>that's</u> a message I want to hear ringing in my heart and mind — every day, not just the days I'm feeling low!

I'm looking forward to a hymn service Sunday on February 2, singing some of our favorite hymns and songs at both services. I'm also looking forward to a sermon series on work and faith. I will return to preparing a study guide each week, and it will be posted on the website along with the sermons each week.

## RUMC FOOD PANTRY and COMMUNITY KITCHEN

What a year we had! The food pantry handed out 2,178 bags of food in 2013. This served 548 individual families. Over 55.000 lbs. of food were handed out, plus 55 bags of school supplies, unlimited clothing, toiletries, cleaning supplies, household items, Panera Bread, and Wawa items. We had over 90 volunteers participate in this ministry adding up to over 3000 volunteer hours. The

**Community Luncheon** opened in April. We served 430 meals and froze 340 meals for distribution at the food pantry. Thirty-two volunteers donated 850 hours of service. In addition, the church was instrumental in sponsoring 19 families for Christmas this year. If you would like to be involved in these ministries in the coming vear, there are lots of ways to be a part of the team. Do you like to

## **How to Become a Member of RUMC**
