### From the Pastor

### **PENTECOST!** A story of WIND, FIRE, AND ECSTACY!

Acts 2: 1-3: When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place, and suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them.

The drama of Pentecost is huge! This story rivals Easter for drama and is just as important to our lives as Christians. The disciples had been huddled in a room, probably dejected and depressed since things hadn't gone the way they had wanted them to, waiting for they knew not what. I would hope that some of them remembered and were focusing on the promise that Jesus was to send a Comforter, but I'm not sure I would have kept my eye on that particular ball — would you? I wonder how real the Resurrection seemed to them on that day after weeks of waiting for something else.

The Holy Spirit definitely got their attention! Enough so that not just the disciples, but people from all over the world, were attracted by the excitement and committed themselves to Christ on that day!

Do you remember John's message to the 7 churches in the Revelation of John? He wrote an individual message to each of the churches, and to the church of Laodicea, he wrote, "I know your works; you are neither cold nor

hot. I wish that you were either cold or hot. So, because you are lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I am about to spit you out of my mouth." (Rev. 3:15-16) The church, born with fire and wind and ecstatic tongues, had already lost the passion. Something dragged them down. The chapter hints at <u>reliance</u> on worldly possessions being part of their ruin.

One of my favorite Pentecost hymns is *See How Great a Flame Aspires* by Charles Wesley. The first verse goes like this:

See how great a flame aspires, kindled by a spark of grace. Jesus' love the nations fires, sets the kingdoms on a blaze. To bring fire on earth he came, kindled in some hearts it is; O that all might catch the flame, all partake the glorious bliss!

This month, high on my prayer list are two things:

- that Jayme Gede, Katie Holsonbake, Ryan McManus, Derek Morris, Jonathan Raab, Maddie Stewart, the 2014 Confirmation Class, will feel the passion of the fire of the Spirit as they make a new commit ment to follow Christ, and
- that each and every one of us will be kindled into a new flame of commitment right along with them!
