We have had a year of highs and lows. At one point I began to think that our year together was highly emotional, and many of us were struggling. We were surprised by several deaths. Many of us were struggling with circumstances in our lives. And just about the time that I was feeling that the emotions were running very high, a mother told me that our prayer for the students who were returning to school had stirred her thinking. She said that her children didn't face too much in terms of drugs or sex as they do violence. And she told me that our young people who attend Franklin High School were required to read *The Other Wes Moore*.

The book is the story of 2 men who grew up in Baltimore's inner city, just a few blocks apart. One Wes lived in one of Baltimore's most intense housing projects: drugs everywhere, broken lights, stairwells that were smelly, little air stirring. The other Wes lived in a house and then moved to New York when his father died, his mother was working late every day and Wes was on the edge of gang involvement. One Wes got involved with the wrong crowd. The other Wes was sent to a military academy by his grandparents. One Wes became a Rhodes Scholar, highly successful businessman and nationally acclaimed author/motivational speaker. The other Wes is in prison for life **because he was involved in the February 2000 shooting death of off-duty Reisterstown UMC member police officer Bruce Prothero.**

Although I realize that not everyone here now knew Bruce, I hear people in the congregation and in the community talk about that event fairly often. It was a tragedy of epic proportions. A family with 5 children under the age of 6 lost their father and husband. The police force lost a respected officer. The community was in deep mourning.

The stories of Wes Moore show how decisions/choices can change a life – or a whole community's life – forever. For good or for ill.

So, I realized that there are many, many ways that story speaks to our life together and in community. What choices are before us that could alter the course of our lives? How many times do we say or do something that affects a relationship? Are we good at coping when circumstances are difficult? Do we respond – or do we react? Do we speak without considering the consequences?

Our January worship theme: **Keep Calm and Trust God.** I'm praying that all of us will find it to be a resource for our living. *Invite a friend to worship with you!*

Every adult faces moments when emotions take over. When emotionalism takes over, we can say or do things that are at least unwise and at most are deeply hurtful to others.



and her brother Jem on their adventures in Maycomb County, Alabama. We also meet their father, Atticus Finch, a lawyer who is assigned to a controversial case.

Earlier this year, Harper Lee published a sequel to: *To Kill a Mockingbird*. Called *Go Set a Watchman*, it was actually written before *To Kill a Mockingbird*, but it takes place years later. Jean Louise Finch is all grown up now and living in New York, but she returns to Maycomb County to visit her father. While there, she discovers something shocking about him that causes her impression of him to change.
