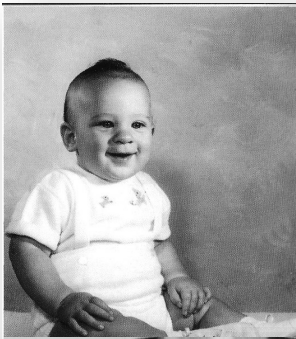

Sunday school, was active in youth group and also a member of a traveling youth choir. When he was young, his family of six could be seen buzzing around town in a Volkswagen beetle. In

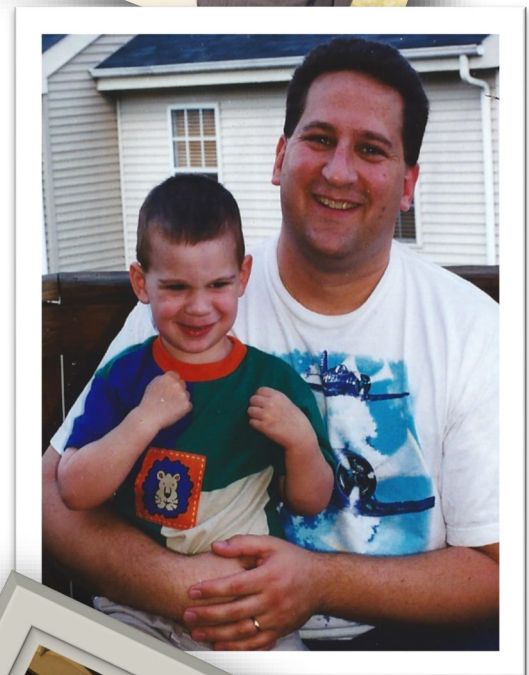
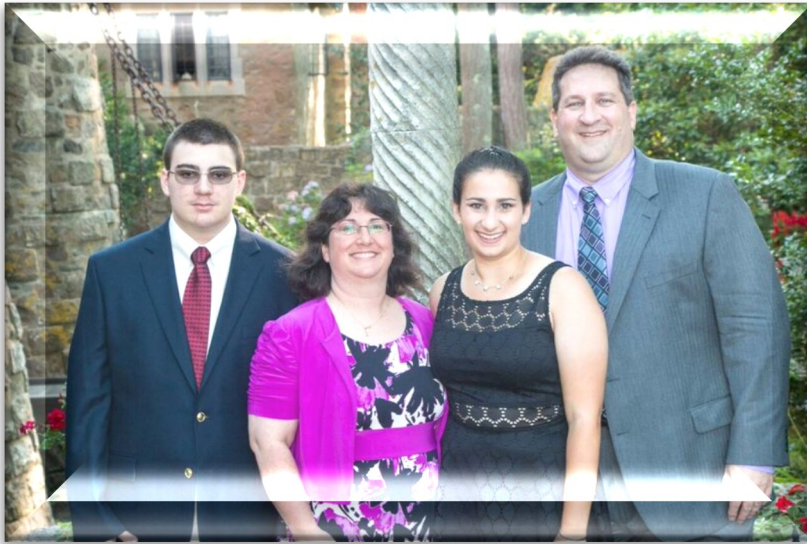

The History and Records Committee has been very busy organizing and purging the records of Reisterstown United Methodist Church. In June we received the first set of record books that were scanned by the Maryland State Archives, funded by the Turnbaugh Trust. These records are available for your viewing on the Maryland State Archives website under special collections, use keyword Reisterstown United Methodist Church. - ◆ Reisterstown Church Record Minutes, Board of Trustees Year 1833-1926, marbled-paper cover
- ◆ Class Attendance Records, 1834-, church records, marbled-paper cover
- ◆ Reisterstown Church Class Book, 1827-, green cover
- ◆ Loose church record pages: Colored Class Membership, 1834; Class Membership 1834-1857

The website, [Find-A-Grave](#), has been updated with the entries from the Reisterstown UM Church cemetery based on the stone transcriptions done by Bea and Ed Gies. If you enjoy taking pictures and are looking for something to do one day, start taking pictures of the stones in the cemetery and upload them to Find-A-Grave. If you don't know how, just let me know and I'll be glad to show you what to do or give them to me and I'll do the upload.

We have also taken some of our VHS tapes to a place to have them converted to DVD, mainly for preservation, but also so you can watch them.

Future plans are to:

- ◆ convert all of the VHS tapes given to us by Bea and Ed Gies of the VIM trips they attended to DVDs
- ◆ get more of our record books scanned for preservation (mostly our trustees' records)
- ◆ get a computer and desk set up in the Library so you can view the DVDs
- ◆ continue to organize all of the paper and pictures that have been collected over the years

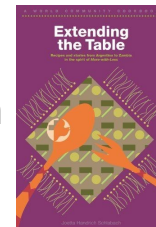
Library Log

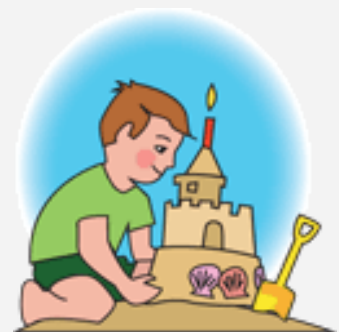
