Last March, I wrote about evangelism – how it's about sharing our faith stories rather than telling people what they should do, how they should think – things like that.

If you were in church on February 21, you may have noticed that we had a lot of visitors. As is often the case, none of them came through the line at the end of the service. It can be a bit intimidating to meet the pastor the first time you visit a church. If you're a regular church attender, that's often exactly what you want to do. However, if you're new, not so much!

So, here's what I've been thinking about and talking with church leaders about in the last week:

- How were these visitors received?
- Where did they come from and why did they come?
- Were they intrigued because of the Wes Moore event?
- Did our visitors come because Easter is just around the corner?
- What in their life's situation made them decide to come to church on that particular day?

I have no idea.

Here's the substance of my prayers for this week:

- Thank you, God, that this congregation worshipped that Sunday with energy and that the congregation was engaged throughout the service.
- Make us all aware of the people you send through our doors.
- Help every regular worshiper to reach out to greet people they don't know, even if they fear that person is already a part of our faith family.
- Give us the courage to ask a question or two that shows we are interested in who each visitor is or offers them help to find what they need.
- Make us mindful that you have sent each of these people to us – another member of the Body of Christ – and that our connection with these sisters and brothers may be the most important connection they make on any given day.

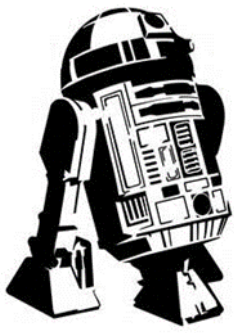
That, my friends, is hospitality-based Evangelism!

**Field Trip to Mission Central—March 12, 2016**

**So what is UMCOR and why is it important to us at RUMC?**

UMCOR stands for the United Methodist Committee on Relief. It provides humanitarian relief and disaster response in the United States and internationally. Efforts are targeted in places where natural disasters, war, or conflict have done so much damage that communities are unable to recover on their own. While UMCOR is not a first-response organization, we stand ready to accompany communities in need over the long haul of their recovery, until they are well on their way to establishing a "new normal" after a crisis. UMCOR seeks to alleviate human suffering without discrimination. We believe all people have God-given worth, dignity and a right to assistance when in need. Some of the ways and places where UMCOR has helped:

- UMCOR and partner work to help Serbia reduce its future vulnerability to flooding.
- Following widespread floods and tornadoes in the U.S. UMCOR volunteers help muck out homes, listen to the needs and giving hope to those impacted.
- Typhoon-resistant community evacuation shelters in the Philippines are part of a disaster risk reduction strategy to weather the next storm.
- After severe floods in India, UMCOR is helping provide clean water to communities.

When the water in Flint, Michigan, became contaminated with lead, UMCOR is aiding in the response to the water crisis.

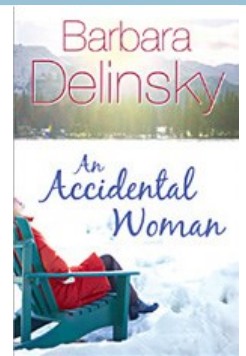
## Library Log

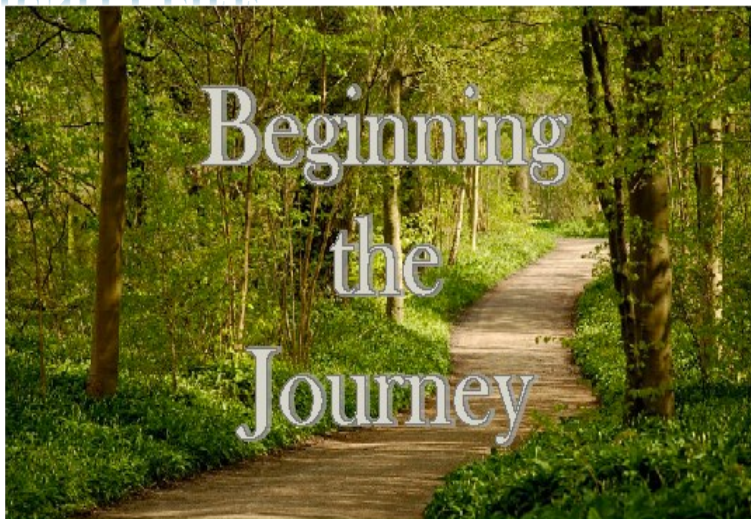

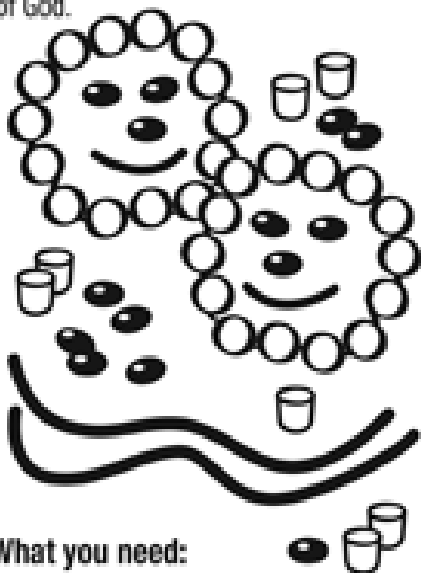

### What you do:

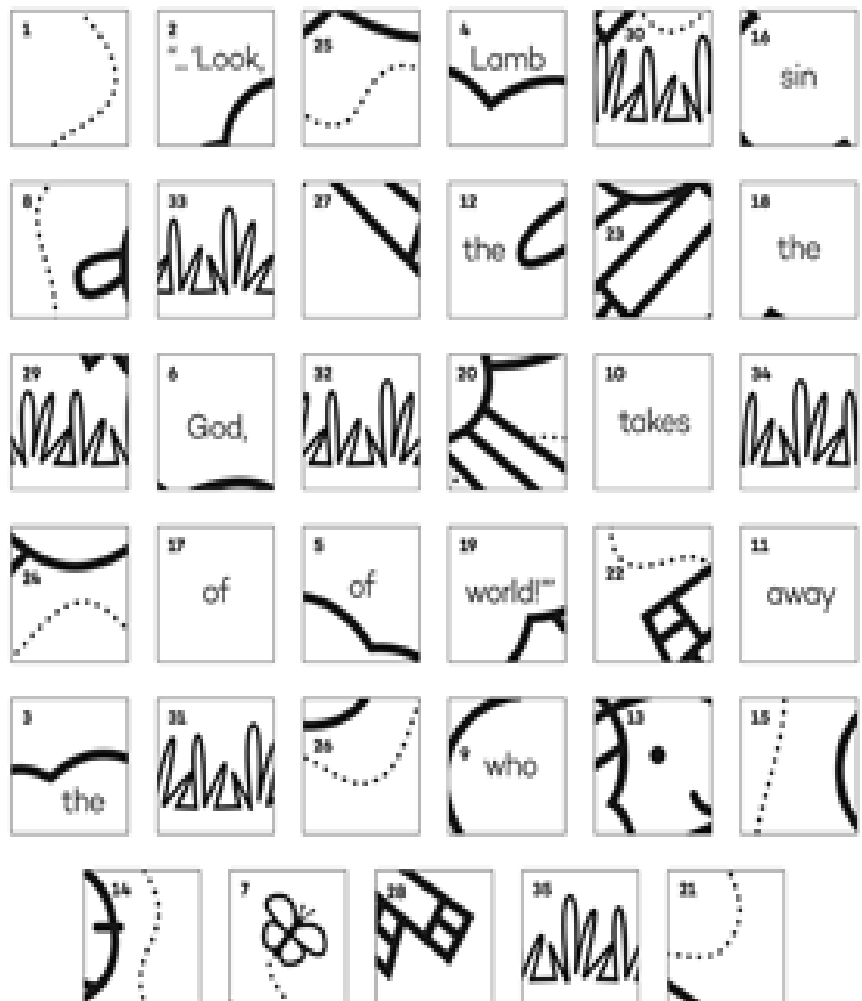
1. Bake and frost the cupcakes.
