Beloved of God,

It seems impossible that we are just a few days away from Easter Sunday. The earth is truly beautiful in its blooming – bursting forth, as it were, but we are closed in, many of us afraid and many frustrated or stressed.

After 40 years in the wilderness, Moses learned that he would not lead the people into the Promised Land – that Joshua would have the privilege of leading the people to their goal. After all that time, after all they had endured, it was natural for the people (and Joshua, too!) to feel stressed. Maybe they were frustrated and afraid, too.

Moses, though, had a Word to share – a Word that we need today just as much as the Israelites did: Be strong and bold; have no fear or dread, because it is the Lord your God who goes with you; God will not fail you or forsake you.” (Deut. 31:6)

Uncertainty and ambiguity make us feel unsteady. Over the next week, as we walk with Jesus and the disciples through the last week of Jesus’ life, remember that the disciples felt uncertain and afraid. Peter’s fear led to his denying that he even knew Jesus. On the night of the Resurrection, the disciples huddled in a room so they were safe (sound familiar?). As we read the familiar story and focus on what happened, ask yourself how your feelings caused by our current global situation may connect with the feelings of the disciples during that week. And notice that they found ways to connect with each other for security and comfort – and to build their faith.

I hope that you are staying connected in meaningful ways. I can’t tell who is participating in worship on Sundays since the majority of those who are in our sessions have been calling in. What I can tell you is that several folks have emailed to tell me that being in worship, even when we’ve had technical issues, has been a balm to their souls. What I can say is: Be strong and bold; have no fear or dread, because it is the Lord your God who goes with you; God will not fail you or forsake you.” (Deut. 31:6) and as we gather on the phone and online, we will support each other and be reminded of just that.

Please join us online or on the phone for devotions on Tuesdays and Thursdays at 6:30 pm throughout this time and also on Sunday mornings at 10 am for worship.

From the Treasurer:

First of all, thank you to the many people who continue to give to the church by mailing in their offerings. If you would like to change to on-line giving, please email me at [pat.botelle2@gmail.com](mailto:pat.botelle2@gmail.com) and I will help you get started.

Many people don't feel comfortable using the online giving option that is available through the church's website. Because we use Farmers and Merchants as our bank, online apps such as Zelle don't work for RUMC. Most banks offer online bill pay. You can set up the church as a "bill" using your envelope number as your account number (if you don't have an envelope number, just put in 9999). Put the church's name and address in and then you can have the bank send the check (yes, they pay the postage!). You can set this up as a one-time event or as a recurring payment.

I do hope you consider online giving. The service we use is very secure and recommended by the General Council on Finance and Administration (GCFA) of The United Methodist Church.

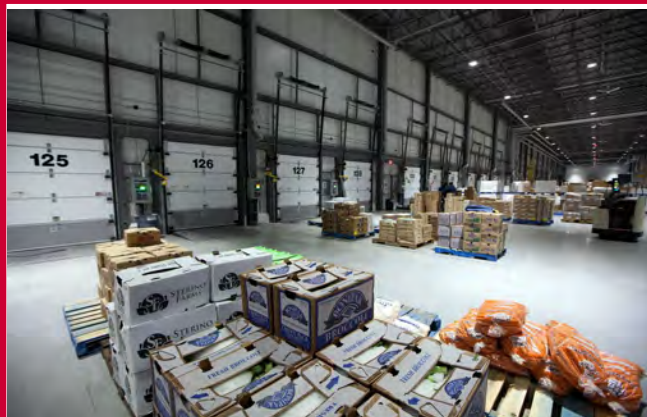

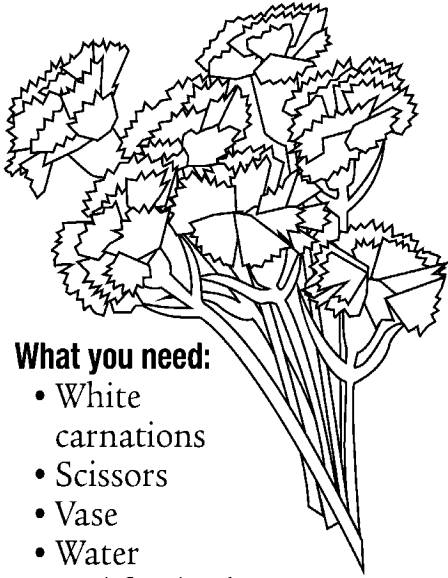

# Scripture AND NATURE

Conduct a simple experiment to illustrate Easter's meaning.



**What you need:**

- White carnations
- Scissors
- Vase
- Water
- Red food coloring
- Bible

**What you do:**

1. Cut the carnation stems (at an angle) to about 8 inches long.
2. Fill the vase halfway with water. Add 10 drops of food coloring. (More may be needed to darken the water.)
3. Add the cut flowers and observe what happens to the petals over time.
4. Discuss how this is like Jesus' work on the cross. Read 1 Peter 2:22-24 (NIV) and reflect on what his death means for us.
5. To learn more about this experiment, research capillary action.
