We are both so grateful for the way Reisterstown UMC launched us into ministry, supported us, and cheered us on.

This July, I will begin an appointment as the District Superintendent of the Cumberland-Hagerstown District. Carol is beginning a new season of ministry with youth and children at Mt. 

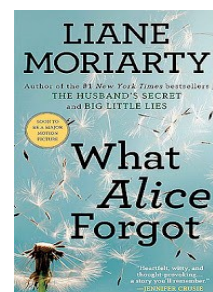
2. The charging station, which is located by the check out desk, is open for business. You may use your own cords or the ones provided.

CHRIST IS RISEN!

Leader: Alleluia! Christ is Risen!

Thus began our worship service on Easter Sunday, April 21, 2019. The church was packed. For the first time in the eight months that we have been here since we arrived on September 10, 2018, every pew had people sited in. Even those who don't attend church regularly were present. Nobody wanted to miss this celebration of the resurrection. There were close to one hundred and fifty people sited in the pews, compare to forty or fifty that attend church normally. The church looked different and the singing was melodiously uplifting. And there was a contagious warmth in the sanctuary.

As we entered deep in worship, we offered this prayer of adoration to God: **Gracious, loving, powerful, creating, and life-giving God, maker of all things visible and invisible; on the first day you spoke and out of chaos came creation and out of darkness came light. On the first day Christ was resurrected and out of death came life. Praise and honor and blessing be to you, o God, Creator, Christ and Holy Spirit, this day and always. Amen!**

The preaching of the day was drawn from Luke 24: 1-12. I stressed the fact that the resurrection of Jesus has changed the course of history. If Jesus did not die on the cross and resurrect from the dead, there would be no Easter Sunday service. There would be no church at all. I wouldn't have come all the way from Africa to preach the good news in Belize, a country that I never heard of before I was assigned as a missionary in this small Central American territory. The death and resurrection of Jesus have torn down human, social, cultural barriers. Black, white, yellow, red, we have become one people: the people of God. The death and resurrection of Jesus has brought to life human relationships that did not exist before: every man is my brother and every woman is my sister. We also realize that mother earth is sacred; she deserved to be given special attention. Jesus is our reason for living.

We had two services on this Easter Sunday morning: one at Epworth Methodist Church in Dangriga, and the other at Sittee River Methodist Church in the town of the same name. In addition to the celebration of the Lord's Supper, we had children baptisms in both places. We baptized one child at Epworth Methodist Church - **Travyn Lopez** - and two at Sittee River Methodist Church - **Isaanra Kelly** and **Joshua Espinoza**. We are thankful to God our Father who adds sons and daughters to His church in every generation. All glory, honor and majesty be to our God. Amen!

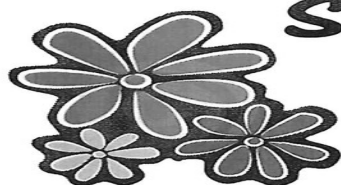

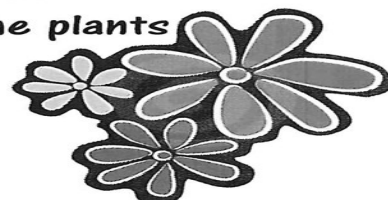

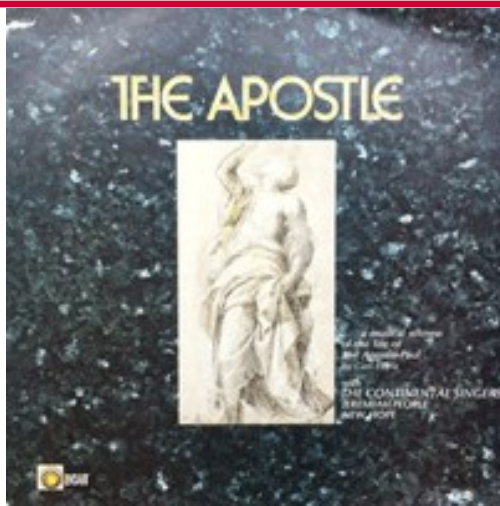
