From the Pastor

Many of you know that Rich and I have a dog named Fynn. Rich fell in love with this little guy (we think he's a Cockapoo, but he <u>might</u> be a Bijapoo!) online. He was up for adoption after his first family faced huge vet bills when he found a "tasty" carcass in the woods behind their home. Brittle bones are a very bad thing for dogs! It tore up his insides and required a couple of surgeries and a very long recovery.

His first family took Fynn to the vet to have him put down because he was so terribly sick. However, one of the vet's techs took him home and loved him back to health even though she couldn't keep him forever.

We've had lots of dogs, every one of them with a distinct personality. Fynn is the first one who really plays and *always* has a ball at the ready. He and Rich had a special game where Rich would throw the ball on the roof and Fynn would catch it. Of course, Rich also did his dead-level best to throw the ball without Fynn seeing where it went, but he found it every time. He runs like the wind, sometimes around and around and around the outside of the house.

About 18 months ago, Fynn started walking into things and panicking – very unlike him – and we learned that he had glaucoma and was losing his sight. Then, about 3 months ago, he lost the sight in his second eye and is now completely blind. Every now and then, we have seen him dragging himself, seemingly depressed, and definitely not the normal, bright-eyed, eager dog we know.

I have been amazed at how he has accommodated to his new situation! We haven't seen much of that sadness lately. Oh, he still walks into things sometimes (especially if his humans leave something in a new place!), but he has learned just where to jump up to get on the bed at night, and he has no trouble finding his food and water. He has taught Rich the route to take when they go for a walk and has limited how far he will go, and he no longer fears going outside. Much more amazing to me, in the last 2 weeks he has begun throwing the ball up **and catching it!**

Every day, it seems, another beloved in our RUMC faith family is struggling with something. Some of our beloved struggle with health issues and can't seem to catch a break. Others struggle with money or time or something else that robs them of their joy or peace or strength. Mental anguish drags us down. As I've watched Fynn, I've wondered about how he has found the strength and courage to move on – to not fear walking into the walls or the furniture – even to go outside and run a little bit. Of course he doesn't know the scriptures, but you and I have God's words to hang onto.



You shop. Amazon gives.

Amazon Smile or Shop Amazon from the Church's Website – Which is Better???

Many of you have asked what the difference is between shopping at Amazon Smile and indicating the church as

the charity or going to the Church's website and clicking on "Shop Amazon" (which takes you to Amazon.com). With either option, RUMC will get a percentage of your purchase price. The difference is in the percent. Amazon donates 0.5% of the price of your eligible AmazonSmile purchases to the charitable organization of your choice. When you shop using the "Shop Amazon" link, the percent given to the church ranges from 2% to 10% for special categories (like games, downloads, Fire products, electronics and computer products) and from 4% to 8.5% for general items. For general items, the percentage increases as the number of items purchased increases and the count is across all buyers, not just each sale. Bottom line is the church will get a higher

percentage of your purchase if you use the "Shop Amazon" link from the website.

Either way, RUMC can benefit from the shopping you do on Amazon, so tell you friends and neighbors to remember RUMC when they shop.



Other times may be scheduled to make up classes due to inclement weather on schedule conflicts. We will also be taking a variety of field trips. (continued on page 13)

What is Confirmation...

Confirmation refers to the decision a person makes to respond to God's grace with intentional commitment, publicly reaffirming his or her baptismal vows before the congregation. Most confirmands are youth between the ages of eleven and fourteen, who have been nurtured in the church since their baptism as an infant or young child. Most churches offer a deliberate time of preparation before this service. During confirmation class, confirmands learn about the meaning of Christian faith; the history and teachings and The United Methodist Church; and an explanation of the baptismal and membership vows they will be professing.

Sometimes United Methodists use the word *confirmation* as reference to the class or preparatory time before the ritual of confirmation. This time or group experience should more accurately be called "confirmation preparation." What is the person preparing for? *By Water and the Spirit: A United Methodist Understanding of Baptism* describes it this way:

When persons who were baptized as infants are ready to profess their Christian faith, they participate in the service, which United Methodism now calls Confirmation. This occasion is not an entrance into Church membership, for this was accomplished through baptism. It is the first public affirmation of the grace of God in one's baptism and the acknowledgment of one's acceptance of that grace by faith. This moment includes all the elements of conversion-repentance of sin, surrender and death of self, trust in the saving grace of God, new life in Christ, and becoming an instrument of God's purpose in the world. The profession of Christian faith, to be celebrated in the midst of the worshiping congregation, should include the voicing of baptismal vows as a witness to faith and the opportunity to give testimony to personal Christian experience.
